PUBLIC PARTICIPATION during working sessions:

While the commissioners are considering listed discussion topics, members of the public may be invited to participate because of a special knowledge the commission may need. Others may be recognized and permitted to participate at the discretion of the President.

To be recognized, a member of the public should raise his or her hand and wait to be recognized by the President. These meetings are intended to be less formal than legislative sessions in order to permit some healthy give-and-take. However, comments and questions should be kept brief and to the point.
